



Media21 fellowship on Human Rights In collaboration with the UNOHCHR, OMCT, TRIAL and Human Rights Watch

The **Objective** is to increase the scope and depth of human rights reportage around the world by offering journalists the information, contacts and understanding on the issue.

The fellowship offers local journalists an opportunity to interact with global players, as well as learn from each other. The end result is to better the quality of reports that appear in the domestic media.

The human rights workshop coincides with the sessions of the UN Human Rights Council. This allows journalists to not only cover the Council for their respective media and sustain an interest in their own countries, but it also allows them to interact with global players. The workshop consists of briefings and interactions with agencies such as the UN, NGOs, government and diplomatic missions.

The workshop is open to English and French-speaking journalists. Six such workshops have been organised so far. It takes a practical approach to knowledge-sharing and believes in learning by doing. The journalists will be mentored by experienced journalists at the *Human Rights Tribune*, an award winning online news source. They will also be provided temporary press accredition to the UN.

Participating journalists produce reports for their own media, as well as contribute toward the production of a special issue of On Assignment, earlier called Human Rights Bulletin (see earlier bulletins http://www.infosud.org/spip/spip.php?article1423, http://www.media21geneva.org/images/human_rights/human%20rights%20september%202 008%20on%20assignment.pdf).

The next workshop will be held during **December 1-5, 2008** and coincides with the Human Rights Council session focusing on Universal Periodical Review (UPR). Selection of the journalists has been made keeping in mind the countries undergoing their UPR this session. We expect journalists from Israel, Palestine, Serbia, Kosovo and Burundi to participate this time. See the draft programme.

The fellowship offers grants to six journalists. The grant will cover their tution fees, flight ticket, accomodation and daily allowance. The grant will not cover visa fees, insurance and vaccination costs, and travel to nearest international airport.
